



The Appellate Panel was established and began during the 2014-15 school year and serves as a final authority in all appeals involving member schools. Member schools must have the ability to appeal a ruling of the subdivisions, conferences, or regions of the League. The Appellate Panel must provide the final ruling in any appeal brought against a decision on appeal from the Executive Committee of the League. Decisions of the Appellate Panel are the final administrative appeal.

The Appellate Panel consists of seven members who serve four year terms. Members are appointed in the following manner: One person appointed by the legislative delegations of each congressional district. Members of the Appellate Panel may not concurrently serve as officers of any League subdivisions, conferences or regions and may not have served as a member of the Executive Committee within the last three years.

Over 114,700 middle and high school student-athletes participate in the 14 SCHSL sanctioned sports. Approximately 1800 medals to include Gold, Silver and Bronze were presented to our student athletes and coaches.

By the #Numbers

Our membership includes 211 middle schools. We have a Middle School Task Force in place to better serve our 7th- 8th grade level athletes, coaches and administrators. The task force was created in 2014 with the mission of meeting the needs of our middle school members in the development and operating their athletic programs. The committee of five principals and four athletic directors from around the state address issues affecting middle school athletics and proposing changes. They meet four times a year to improve all aspects of the middle school experience.





The SCHSL is a leader in National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) online course downloads. We strongly encourage habitual studying and research of rules and safety concerns offered in each sport. Over 8.4 million courses have been downloaded by coaches across the nation and SC takes pride in leading the cause. Mandatory courses for every SCHSL coach prior to the start of the school year include:

- Concussion Course
- Heat Illness Prevention Course
- Sudden Cardiac Arrest

“Anyone Can Save A Life” is an emergency action plan program for after-school practices and events. Our coaches are provided materials along with the online course in order to better prepare for potential emergencies that may require first aid or CPR assistance from first responders.




