The **mission** of the South Carolina High School League is to provide governance and leadership for interscholastic athletic programs that promote, support, and enrich the educational experience of students.



2020-21 PRIORITES

1

Offer more equitable opportunities for promoting and publicizing the play of the League's female sports.

On the cusp of the 50th anniversary of the landmark TITLE IX law, we started our own recognition of female sports and student-athletes. Throughout the school year, SCHSL highlighted standout athletes as each sports season concluded with live, online conversations to discuss their journey and what the future holds. The league also gained new business partners that were keen on working solely with our female sports, A concerted effort in securing more female officials in all sports was put into action as well.



2

Research more equitable ways to complete realignment/reclassification of member schools to include factors other than enrollment size.

The league created a committee reflective of all classes and regions to decipher if there were alternative ways to realign/reclassify member schools. Alternative methods were researched with geographic location, poverty index and distance to each school's nearest city hall. The realignment process is completed every two years with continued input not only from committee members but the membership as a whole. All member schools have the opportunity to appeal realignment placement once completed. 2021-22 is a realignment year in which new methods will be discussed and possibly incorporated. *The survey feedback from member schools resulted in satisfactory ratings on the current method.



2021-22 PRIORITES

1

Review the SCHSL Handbook for possible updating

With an organization over 100 years old, its policies must be revisited periodically. An evaluation committee has been formed for SCHSL rules and regulations, constitution, and by-laws review. They are charged with examining the handbook section by section for updates that reflect the modern changes within schools, communities and families.

2

Explore the formation of statewide middle school invitationals in selected sports

In conjunction with the Middle School Task Force, a committee is formed to evaluate the pros and cons of creating state-wide invitationals, not championships, for select middle school sports. This will provide our younger athletes the opportunity to become more involved and better prepared in athletics.

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Explore the feasibility and creation of an SCHSL endowment foundation for Student Services Initiatives

Explore funding resources that may be available in the business community to enhance our student service offerings to better equip athletes to become well-rounded citizens of the Palmetto State. This is an option to fund these services at little to no cost to the member schools.




SCHOL SCHOL SPORTSMANSHIP

The Appellate Panel, established in 2014, consists of seven members who serve four-year terms. Members are appointed in the following manner:

- One person appointed by the legislative delegations of each congressional district.
- Members of the Appellate Panel may not concurrently serve as officers of any the South Carolina High School League subdivisions, conferences or regions and may not have served as a member of the South Carolina High School League Executive Committee within the last three years.
- The Appellate Panel provides the final ruling in appeals brought against a decision on appeal from the Executive Committee of the League.
- Decisions made by the Appellate Panel are the final administrative appeal.



- Sportsmanship To teach respect for self, opponents, officials, rules, and the game itself with heavy emphasis on inclusion.
- Coaches, Athletes & Parents Education- To provide resources and support for coaches, athletes and parents who serve as curriculum instructors of educational athletics. NFHSLearn.org and SCHSL.org
- Health & Wellness To empower students to make healthy life choices with emphasis on safety; mentally, physically and emotionally.
- Service to Community To recognize the privilege of athletic participation and the responsibility of giving back to the community.

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
