NONETHELESS, I AM CONFIDENT THAT YOU WILL MEET THOSE CHALLENGES WITH AUTHORITY AND COMMITMENT TO DO THE RIGHT THING EVEN WHEN IT’S NOT POPULAR.

YOUR SCHSL IS CONTINUOUSLY CHALLENGED BY OUTSIDE INFLUENCES AND INFLUENCERS, BUT KNOW THE LEAGUE STAFF WILL CONTINUE TO REPRESENT THE SCHSL IN THE APPROPRIATE MANNER. WE KNOW THAT SPORTSMANSHIP AND FAIR PLAY ARE TWO OF THE HIGHEST EXPECTATIONS OF AND FOR THIS ASSOCIATION. EACH MEMBER SCHOOL PLAYS A ROLE IN MEETING THESE EXPECTATIONS. OUR MEMBER SCHOOLS MUST CONTINUE TO ELEVATE THE EXPECTATIONS OF THEIR STUDENT-ATHLETES, COACHES, AND SPECTATORS. IN THE LAST FEW WEEKS, I HAVE BEEN MADE AWARE OF SPECTATOR ISSUES THAT HAVE CARRIED OVER TO THE FIELD OF PLAY, COACHES BEING EJECTED FOR UNSPORTSMANLIKE BEHAVIORS AND ATHLETES BEING EJECTED FOR UNSPORTSMANLIKE BEHAVIOR. THIS PAST WEEK, EJECTIONS, UNFORTUNATELY, INCREASED. ADDITIONALLY, THERE WAS A SCHOOL TEAM THAT HAS HAD TWO GAMES WITH EJECTIONS.

TO THOSE SCHOOLS WITH NO EJECTIONS LAST WEEK, CONGRATULATIONS. TO THOSE SCHOOLS WITH EJECTIONS LAST WEEK, CONTINUE TO PURSUE A WEEK OF NO EJECTIONS. ONCE AGAIN, I CHALLENGE EACH OF YOU TO CONTINUE TO MAKE GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP A PRIORITY IN YOUR ATHLETICS PROGRAMS.

The South Carolina High School League is partnering with the South Carolina Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services (DAODAS) to build awareness in our schools about the growing danger created by fentanyl. There has been a rise in overdose deaths for more than five years in both South Carolina and across the country. Over the last two years, more than 1,200 South Carolinians, including students, have overdosed on fake oxycodone pills containing fentanyl. While fake pills look like real ones, they can be deadly!

We are asking for your help by inserting the following public address announcements into your game scripts for all athletic events during the remainder of September. We also ask that you send an email to <mailto:derek@schsl.org> if you have a video board in use at your facility for which DAODAS can provide graphics to post in conjunction with the reading of the PA announcements.
