2023-24 League Pass Information

The South Carolina High School League is switching from DragonFly to HomeTown for its League Passes. An email has been sent to Principals and Superintendents. If you have not received your email by now, please check the directory on the SCHSL website to ensure your information is up-to-date.

Despite the change from DragonFly to HomeTown, the rules will remain the same for the number of passes that are available to each school. Please see Article VII in the SCHSL By-Laws for details.

High School League passes will be issued as follows:

DISTRICT OFFICE: 2 Passes: one each for the Superintendent and/or district athletic director. **MIDDLE SCHOOLS:** (4 Passes Total)

HIGH SCHOOLS: will receive one (1) each for the principal, athletic director, and each varsity sport offered. There will be a \$25 charge for all passes requested after the allotted number.

2023-24 League Pass Update

Principals and Athletic Directors:

Below is the progress of the distribution of the SCHSL League Pass through HomeTown.

HomeTown has fulfilled more than 3,000 passes to date, They accumulate the data that is submitted each day and bulk upload that data on Fridays. If you submit on Friday, it won't make the bulk upload.

Please make sure you do **NOT** give the link to your coaches. This is to be completed by the principal or one designee. When the form is submitted, that is the final approval for the pass. Your school will be billed for those that exceed the free pass limit.

The instructions were only sent to principals because of this approval process. If you didn't receive the instructions, it is likely your directory entry is not up to date. You can view the help menu on the SCHSL website for instructions on how to update the directory.

If you submitted the forms for your passes, and they have not appeared in the HomeTown Fan app, please email Keith Warren at Keith@schsl.org, he can check to see if your data has been received. Please **do not** email or call HomeTown. They have been swamped with emails and calls, and that slows down the process.

SCHSL FALL SPORTS UNDERWAY



The South Carolina High School League (SCHSL) slate of 2023 Fall Sports got underway last Monday (August 14) with Boys' and Girls' Swimming and Girls' Golf.

Football opened on Friday (August 18), while Girls' Tennis, Boys' and Girls' volleyball, and Boys' and Girls' Cross-Country opened their season on August 21. The final Fall Sport, Competitive Cheer, will open next Monday, August 28.

Boys' and Girls' Swim will be the first Fall Sports to contest State Finals. The State Finals are October 14 (Girls) and October 16 (Boys). Both events will be at the University of South Carolina Natatorium.

Fall Sports will culminate with the Football State Finals from November 30-December 2. The three-day Finals will be at the Oliver C. Dawson (Willie E. Jeffries Field) on the South Carolina State University (SC State) campus.

Medical Timeouts

Last week, the SCHSL released new guidelines for medical timeouts prior to games. This document is designed to prepare medical personnel, game administrators, officials, and all personnel responsible for the medical well-being of athletes for an emergency.

This pre-event dialogue provides an opportunity to clarify medical protocols, including the Emergency Action Plan, ensuring everyone is on the same page regarding the procedures and expectations in the event of a medical emergency.

Ultimately, these gatherings not only optimize medical preparedness but also reinforce a collaborative and supportive atmosphere that contributes to the overall success and safety of the competition.

With health and safety being the highest priority for our student-athletes, the SCHSL strongly urges all member schools to implement a medical timeout before all competitions, specifically before high-risk activities.

The Official's Role at Interscholastic Contest

Officials are participants in the educational development of student-athletes. The role of the official in an interscholastic contest is to remain aware of the risk of injury that competition poses to student-athletes and to enforce the rules of play. Game management is the role of the school administration. Officials are not responsible for controlling spectator behavior. Promote positive fan behavior by taking care of inappropriate behavior swiftly so that all can enjoy participating and viewing in a safe and enjoyable environment that should be present at all interscholastic contests.
