CHAMPIONSHIP RECAP

2023 Swimming State Finals Recap



The 2023 SCHSL Girl's and Boy's State Finals were held this Saturday and Monday, October 14 & 16, at the Unviersity of South Carolina Natatorium. At the end of the two day event, three girl's teams and three boy's teams were crowned champions.

Bishop England High School and St. Joseph's Catholic School caputred the Girl's and Boy's Class AAA State Title, respectively. Eastside High School captured both Girl's and Boy's Class AAAA Titles, while Fort Mill High School captured both the Girl's and Boy's Class AAAAA Titles.

While no State Records fell on the boy's side, three State Records were set on the girl's side, all by Eastside High School. The Eastside High School Girl's 200 Yard Freestyle Relay Team of Lauren Adams, Grace Fowler, Darcy O'Sullivan and Hyaden Penny, set a new meet record with a time of 1:35.64. The Girl's 400 Yard Freestyle Relay team of Penny, Eva Kelly Tzouvelekas, Fowler and Lilla Bognar, set the meet record with a time of 3:28.18. That previous 200 Yard Freestyle and 400 Yard Freestyle Records were both set by Eastside last year (2022).

Individually, Bognar eclisped her previous meet record (54.81) by more than a second in the 100 Yard Backstroke with a time of 53.28 to capture Gold.



2023 Middle School Volleyball Regional Invitational



The SCHSL will hold the 2023 Middle School Volleyball Regional Invitational, Saturday, October 21. There will be four sites for the Invitational: Spartanburg High School, Airport High School, Lugoff-Elgin High School and Fort Dorchester High School. Admission is \$10 per person.

Application Process: To be considered for the tournament, at the end of your season, your school will need to submit an application, due no later than today, **Tuesday**, **October 17th**. Schools with multiple teams will be able to submit an application for one team only. Teams who are selected will have to pay a \$125 entry fee. A championship plaque will be presented to the winner of each regional tournament.

Certified CPR/AED Course Requirement

The NFHS has recently released a CPR/AED course on the NFHSLearn website found here: https://nfhslearn.com/courses/cpr-aed. While this is a valuable educational resource that can be utilized as a supplement to CPR/AED training, it does not meet the requirements of CPR/AED certification. All coaches will still need to take the CPR/AED certification training with a hands-on component in order to meet the requirements of the SCHSL.

The SCHSL recommends CPR/AED training through the American Heart Association or American Red Cross that contains the hands-on portion of the training.
