

The South Carolina High School League (SCHSL) is partnering with the South Carolina Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services (DAODAS) to build awareness among parents/caregivers on the importance of talking to their youth about the dangers of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs.

Research shows that children as young as nine (9) are starting to form opinions of alcohol and drug use and parents/caregivers can make a difference. It is never too early or too late to have conversations with your children. If you are not talking to your kids about drugs and alcohol, someone else is. More than 80% of kids ages 10 to 18 say their parents are the leading influence in their decisions and attitudes towards alcohol and other drugs. Starting open conversations early and having them often will create a good foundation for future behaviors and decision making.
