Student-Athlete of the Month





The SCHSL is pleased to announce the January 2024 Student-Athletes of the Month. Anna Grace Brown of Waccamaw High School has been named the Girl's Student-Athlete of the Month and Andre McFadden-Pressley of Lake City High School has been named the Boy's Student-Athlete of the Month

Brown is a member of the Lake City Girls Golf Team. She is a five-time Regional Champion (Team) and has earned six-year varsity letters at Waccamaw. Brown is a three-year varsity captain and was selected to the All-Tournament Team at the Charleston Classic (2023). She was a member of the South Carolina Junior Golf Association, the First Tee of Coastal Carolina where she has served as Teen Board President (Coastal Carolina Chapter 11-12), the Dustin Johnson Golf School and Hurricane Junior Golf Tour.

Academically, Brown has a 4.521 GPA, is a three-year member of the National Honor Society and was selected to represent Waccamaw at the 2022 SC Youth Leadership Conference. She was a member of the Student Council in grades 9th-11th and was nominated for Queen of Hearts in her 10th and 11th grade years. She is a member of Belin United Methodist Church.

McFadden-Pressley is a senior three-sport athlete at Lake City. The football, wrestling, and track athlete is a 2023 Shrine Bowl Selection. In 2022, he finished third in the state in wrestling and was an All-American in the same sport. McFadden-Pressley was a 2021 State Champion in wrestling and in 2020, he was a State Runner-up in wrestling. Additionally, McFadden-Pressley is a three-time All-State in football and wrestling.

Academically, he carries a 3.76 GPA, and is a member of the National Honor Society enrolled in the dual-enrollment college curriculum program.

He has clocked 100-plus hours of community service with the Lake City High School Athletic Department and is a member of the school's Lighthouse Leadership Group and Gentlemen's Club Leadership Group.

Cold Weather Guidelines

Below are a few tips for your school to use to Bench Bad Behavior at contests:

- 1. Official's are to ensure the integrity and safety of student-athletes on the floor or field, but it is the Administration's role at each contest to handle inappropriate behavior of spectators immediately. When you see a spectator getting out of hand, take care of it then and there. Remember, what you allow, you promote.
- 2. Be sure to have security present. You know your spectators, have the appropriate amount of security for your contests. (ie. rivalry games)
- 3. If you have a student section at your contests, be sure to set parameters for their behavior. Meet with students to establish baselines for behavior at contests.
- Positively cheer on your school's team
- Do not make negative or degrading remarks towards the officials or opposing team.
