

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### **2024-25 League Pass**

### Superintendents, Principals, and Athletic Directors

Information pertaining to the process for applying for SCHSL passes was sent via e-mail from the Director of Technology on August 9, 2024. Please refer to the email as it contains important information about the process.

The process will be with a company that specializes in digital passes. It will be very similar to the process last year, but we will have complete control of the workflow. A form will be filled out by the principals and superintendents with the name, email address, cell phone number, and position of each person who should receive a pass. An email will then be sent to the recipient of the pass with instructions to download the pass and add a photo to the pass.

The instructions containing the link to the form will be sent to the principals and superintendents only. This will ensure that the principals and superintendents have control over who is allowed to get a pass. Keep in mind that the school will be charged for any number of passes that exceed the free threshold. Invoices will be sent in the spring.

## Officials' Whistle

### The Official's Role at Interscholastic Contest

Officials are participants in the educational development of student-athletes. The role of the official in an interscholastic contest is to remain aware of the risk of injury that competition poses to student-athletes and to enforce the rules of play.

Game management is the role of the school administration. Officials are not responsible for controlling spectator behavior. It is the role of the Promote positive fan behavior by taking care of inappropriate behavior swiftly so that all can enjoy participating and viewing in a safe and enjoyable environment. Always remember, what you permit is what you promote!

## **The Health Spot**

### EAP WEEK SCENARIOS AND CONSIDERATIONS

August 12-16, 2024, is Emergency Action Plan (EAP) Practice week. Below are some example rehearsal scenarios and considerations that your teams can practice.

#### Scenarios

- 1. Response to a catastrophic injury with NO athletic trainer available: Exertional Heat Stroke
- 2. Response to a catastrophic injury with an athletic trainer NOT on scene: cardiac arrest
- 3. Response to a catastrophic injury with an athletic trainer available: Neck Injury

#### Considerations

Key considerations to remember as you rehearse your EAP:

- 1. Know your stakeholders involved in responding to the EAP
- 2. Know the location of key responders

3. Know the timing and location of the emergency (home/away, practice/game, morning/evening, etc)

- 4. Individuals with the emergency (athlete, coach, official, spectator, etc)
- 5. Possible scenarios (neck, cardiac arrest, unidentified collapse, etc)
