STAY ON THE BENCH!!

As we move deeper into the fall athletic season, it's encouraging to see a positive trend in our football games. After a challenging first week with 28 ejections, we've seen a significant drop to just 12 ejections in the following week. This progress reflects the hard work of our League in educating spectators, student-athletes, and coaches on the importance of sportsmanship.

However, we must continue to focus on the areas that need improvement. The most common types of ejections we're seeing are due to violent conduct and dissent toward officials. This is a concerning trend, and we urge all member schools to reinforce the importance of maintaining composure during games.

Another critical area that requires immediate attention is the number of student-athletes leaving the bench to join heated situations on the field. To address this, we recommend implementing specific drills that emphasize the importance of staying in place. Code phrases like "stay in place" or "take a seat" can serve as quick reminders to players about their responsibility to remain on the bench during altercations.

It is crucial to remember that coaches and officials are responsible for handling conflicts. When players leave the bench to get involved, it not only escalates the situation but also results in severe consequences, including ejection and a one-game suspension.

By consistently reinforcing these guidelines and practicing these drills, we can work together to reduce ejections and maintain the integrity of our games. Let's make it clear: staying on the bench is not just about following the rules—it's about ensuring the safety and sportsmanship of everyone involved.

2024-25 League Pass

Superintendents and Principals

We have received many emails regarding the link to upload the photo to the pass. The link will only work if you already have a pass. It does not request the pass for you.

Information pertaining to the process for applying for SCHSL passes was sent via e-mail from the Director of Technology on August 9, 2024. Please refer to the email as it contains important information about the process.

The Magic Link is a way to verify your identity without having to create an account and password. It's a shortcut.

Below is the process for obtaining the 2024-25 passes:

- 1. Superintendent or Principal fills out a Cognito form containing each person who will receive a pass.
- 2. Data is uploaded into Cuseum's database.
- 3. Emails are sent to each recipient listed on Cognito form with download instructions.

4. Once you download the Pass, the Pass recipient can upload their photo using the photo upload link.

- The email with the pass download instructions will come from membership@cuseum.com.
- The email with the magic link will come from memberportal@cuseum.com.

Retiree Pass Information

Retiree Passes: The conversion of the new digital system is complete. New retiree's and those with Retiree Passes that contain an expiration date should fill out the form at the link below to obtain a pass.

The Health Spot

Tragically, an Alabama high school football player passed away after sustaining a head injury during a football game. Although the exact cause of death is unknown at this time, let this incident serve as a reminder to make sure we are diligent with recognizing the signs and symptoms of a suspected concussion.

In the worst case scenario, an athlete may develop second impact syndrome where they sustain a second concussion before the original one has healed. This second impact can cause rapid and severe brain swelling, leading to catastrophic consequences such as brain damage, permanent disability, or even death.

It is imperative that an athlete who exhibits and/or reports any signs of a concussion be evaluated by an appropriate health care professional before returning to play. For more information on concussions and second impact syndrome visit the CDC website below: <u>https://www.cdc.gov/heads-up/</u>

On August 21, 2024, the South Carolina High School League's (SCHSL) Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) members held their first official meeting of the 2024-2025 school year. SCHSL SAAC President, Kelly Gristwood (Sumter High School), presided over the meeting.

During this meeting, the Council solidified their theme for the year: **#InItTogether**. This theme was selected to emphasize the importance of mental and physical wellness among student-athletes across the state, promoting a sense of unity and support within the community.
